(Windsor, ON) - The Windsor Spitfires are proud to announce a charitable commitment from TeachersLife as part of the club's MVP Program, through which the JumpStart Windsor-Essex Student Nutrition Program will receive a donation of \$1,000.

Prior to the third period of this Sunday's game versus Kingston, a cheque will be presented to the Jumpstart Nutrition Program on behalf of TeachersLife and the Windsor Spitfires Foundation.
